

Dear parishioners,

Today's feast of the Most Holy Trinity is one of celebrations that leads us from the "high" of Easter & Pentecost to "ordinary" life in the Spirit, the everyday living of our Baptism.

We do not attempt to "explain" the mystery of the Trinity. We allow our minds "time off" and respond with our hearts. Like Moses, we stand with a God whose nature is mercy, graciousness, kindness, and fidelity; all we can do is offer thanks and praise.

We try, day by day, to let the *grace of Jesus, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit,* guide all our relationships toward mutual forgiveness, encouragement, agreement and peace. This will be especially important in our local Church, and in our parishes, as we learn how to live and work together in new ways.

The real "new" of *All Things New* will be learning how to share the Gospel. The words of today's Gospel are very familiar – at every sporting event there is someone with a sign that reads "John 3:16," that is, *God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.*

John 3:17-18 – the second part of our reading – is also important. In a culture that is quick to condemn, to cancel, to reject, to isolate, we Christians take another approach. God's desire is not condemnation but salvation, by way of undeserved mercy. Only those who choose to reject such an offer of grace will find themselves "on the outside." Even so, the door to God – Jesus Christ himself, *the gate of the sheepfold* – remains open for all who come to faith.

Our mission is to show the way.

GOOD NEWS ABOUT OUR IMMIGRANT & REFUGEE MINISTRY

Kevin Kuehl has been hired as Coordinator of the Immigrant & Refugee Ministry, a six-parish collaborative, including St Pius V. Kevin lives in South St. Louis and is a member of St. Margaret of Scotland Parish.

Kevin is bilingual and served in Trujillo, Honduras, and Annunciation House in El Paso, Texas. A few of his experiences include Solidarity at the Border Pilgrimage Planning Committee of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, and accompanying a refugee couple from Afghanistan as they settle in St. Louis. Kevin will begin on August 1 and will have an office at St Pius.

The Immigrant and Refugee Ministry is supported by grants received from the Annual Catholic Appeal and other generous organizations; as well as by each of the collaborating parishes. Donations are always welcome.

The collaborating Churches are St. Anthony of Padua, St. Cronan, St. John the Baptist, St. Margaret of Scotland, St. Pius V and St. Vincent DePaul. The Board includes representatives from each of these parishes, as well as immigrants and refugees and others from the community at large. **Your parish representatives are S. Gen Cassani, SSND and Ruth Ehresman.**

The Immigrant & Refugee Ministry is a relational, welcoming ministry that strives to uphold the worth and dignity of each person. The Immigrant and Refugee mission is to welcome, assist and advocate on behalf of immigrants/refugees and create bridges among members of participating parishes and immigrant/refugee families. IRM's work will be done without regard to parish boundaries, religious preference, ethnic or national background.

The Ministry augments services provided by the city, state and/or community. Kevin will be asking for volunteers from all the parishes. We will connect Church volunteers with immigrants and refugees. We will learn about the local, state, and national policies that affect Immigrants and refugees. In this way, the IRM will deepen the commitment of volunteers and church members to work for greater justice for our brothers and sisters.

We are proud of this NEW COLLABORATIVE MINISTRY and hope you will be too.
