1 Thes 1:1-5b



"You shall love your neighbor as yourself" Sister Regina Siegfried, ASC

You might recall the trick question in last week's gospel: "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Today's Gospel is from the same chapter in Matthew and voices another test from "a scholar of the law": "Which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Jesus traps the scholar of the law in his own verbal nets with a response that parallels not subordinates the two great commandments. The choice of *like* & and in describing the two commandments is deliberate. We are to love God and our neighbor.

Who is your neighbor? The people who live next to you or across the street are neighbors. Stretch the description to encompass all people in the body of Christ and listen to the first reading with a broader notion of *neighbor*. The reading from the book of Exodus expands *neighbor* to include aliens, widows, orphans, poor neighbors and then reminds the Israelites that they too were once "aliens in the land of Egypt." We know enough gospel stories to realize that our neighbor is anyone in need of our care, compassion, and resources.

Only the 100% native Americans are not immigrants, refugees, or aliens in this land. The rest of us have ancestors who came from another country, yet we Catholics can quickly adopt the prejudices of the WASP mindset, forgetting that Catholics were the targets of WASP hatred. Immigrants, refugees, and people seeking political asylum are our neighbors not objects of discrimination or considered "the others" who merits are disdained simply because they may look, dress, speak, and live differently than we do.

Jesus's message about loving all is clear direct and unequivocal: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love yourself, your family, friends, immigrants, refugees, the street people who are our guests, and "the others" who are also fellow parishioners and members of the household of God. Love "the other" who lurks within your own shadow self. But love in an up close and personal way. Immigrants, however we describe them, are people with stories and struggles and joys. Love your neighbor as yourself.




