


Annual Impact Report

care items, & diapers.





Growing Need and Rising Costs



Every utility in St. Louis has increased its rates. Combined with more extreme weather, families face dramatically higher utility costs. While rents have risen sharply since the pandemic, wages and fixed benefits (disability, Social Security, SSI) have not kept pace.

Our family utility assistance increased by 100% from last year.



Rising food costs continue to affect incomestrapped families. Our food pantry has increased donations of staples and "distressed" food to meet these growing needs.

This year's food donations were valued at over \$240,000. Purchased food totaled \$165,538.



Networks of Support & Opportunity



Affinia Health & Oak Tree Health helped pantry visitors **Health** apply for health insurance, make appointments, and create a medical home. Affinia provided COVID vaccinations. A Deaconess Parish Nurse provided flu shots, checked blood pressure, and answered health questions.



We invited neighbors who visited the pantry to register to vote or update their registration if they had moved.



St. Pius V partnered with Ameren and Spire Assistance workers who trained volunteers and helped fill out energy assistance applications.



Safety

The pantry offered free gun locks through the Lock it for Love Program of Women's Voices Raised for Social Justice. We encouraged safe storage to protect children and individuals with suicidal ideation from accessing firearms.
