

Dear parishioners,

Today, and next Sunday, I present to you my last financial report as pastor of St Pius V.

Part 1. History.

When I first arrived in November, 2015, there was a capital campaign underway. Our parish raised over a million dollars to repair and renovate our church and our church hall. Fr. John Vien explained that the exterior work was complete, and left it to me to finish the interior. Unfortunately for him, exterior repairs are often hidden and unappreciated, even though essential. I was able to enjoy with you the new look of the church and Singler Hall. The capital campaign was an extraordinary work of devotion by and for our parish community.

Old buildings are never maintenance free; as I like to put it, every day something breaks. I am disappointed that once again water has damaged the ceilings of our beautiful church. During the capital campaign repairs, the roof was patched but not completely replaced. Our workhorse heating and air-conditioning system will also require attention soon. New electrical supply lines and panel were installed for the rectory to replace the underground conduits that were rusting out.

Our buildings are not our only expense. The main expense in any parish is personnel: salaries, insurance and other benefits. Due to the COVID pandemic, we were unable to host our usual fundraisers, our Fabulous Fish Fry and our Oktoberfest, for a few years. We relied on these events to increase our revenue enough to meet our expenses.

Our Immigrant & Refugee Ministry is strongly supported by the Annual Catholic Appeal. This ministry was once again approved for a grant for the coming year. St Pius will again provide office space and support for this expanding ministry.

In the past couple of years, some extraordinary gifts came our way. Long-time parishioners and a long-time friend of the parish remembered St Pius in their wills. Some of these gifts came just at the time we were falling behind in revenue.

The largest single gift was from the estate of Miss Carol King. St Pius Parish is the beneficiary of two IRA's, totaling over \$3 million. With the agreement of our parish Finance Council, \$2.5 million has been invested in a series of certificates of deposit, with terms of one to five years. I hope that with careful management, these funds will provide for any shortfall through the next decade.

The numbers will be published in the bulletin next week.


Free Clinic Housing Needed



NEWS FROM OUR FOOD PANTRY



Your lose your job. Your hours are cut. You have a baby. A relationship ends. Your car breaks down and you can't get to work. Your disability or social security check doesn't stretch to cover your rent and utilities.

These are some of the realities that bring increasing numbers of neighbors to our Food Pantry or to our St. Vincent De Paul phone lines to ask for help with rent, utilities, car repair, or vouchers for beds, clothing or other furniture. You pray for the hungry. Then you feed them. That's how prayer



Who are some of the neighbors helped over the past 2 month?

Joyce, who is now back to work as a nurses' aide at a Children's Hospital. She was unable to pay her electric bill while on maternity leave and faces disconnection.

Allen, who fell behind on his rent because he needed to repair his car. He works as a Door Dash driver.

Ben, who works for a contracted food service at a public school. When school closed, he was laid off. He is looking for employment, but is behind on his rent after missing just one paycheck. His earnings are so low that he will never catch up.

Carol, who receives just \$941 per month from SSI. Her monthly rent is \$650 and she cannot pay both utilities and rent in any given month. Her gas is disconnected and she faces disconnection of her Ameren service.
