

Dear parishioners,

In the early days of Christianity, the phrase *Jesus is Lord* was a dangerous thing to say. Since the emperors of Rome had declared themselves gods and lords, anyone who gave allegiance to another ruler was guilty of treason and very likely sentenced to imprisonment, exile or death.

On this final Sunday of the church year, we name Jesus *Christ the King*. This feast is much more recent, only since 1925. Pope Pius XI was concerned about the increasing secularization and atheism of those times, and he wanted to assert the supreme authority of Christ over all humanity and all human institutions. Perhaps he also envisioned an ideal Christian society, unified in faith as well as in governance.

We Americans have distanced ourselves from monarchy as a form of government. We use the term “king” in reference to sports figures, musicians, and sandwiches. Yet we do know what real kings are. We understand that kingship means uniqueness, importance, and authority.

Nevertheless, *Jesus is Lord*, as Scripture proclaims, and he is a king, though not in the worldly or political sense. His authority is not from men. He is Lord because he is the Son of God. He is king because he “alone is the Holy One, the Lord, the Most High” as we sing at Mass. His kingdom consists of those who will follow him with all hearts and minds, those who choose to serve him regardless of the cost. His people are among those named in today’s Gospel, along with those who are aware that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters we do for him.

This coming Thursday is **Thanksgiving Day**; we will celebrate the **Eucharist at 9 AM in the church**. Many are unable to gather and celebrate as in times past, but we are always together in spirit at the altar of the Lord. Please know how thankful I am to be part of this St Pius family, and that I pray for you with gratitude. May God grant us all another year of life and health.

ST. PIUS V SVDP FOOD PANTRY FUND RAISER

What if you didn't know where your next meal was coming from? Many people know this feeling all too well, especially because of the pandemic, lost jobs, and reduced hours.

The St. Pius V St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry is seeking to raise \$15,000 to carry us through the end of 2020. This ambitious campaign is to raise funds to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables, frozen meat, canned and boxed goods, and personal care and household items. We've been able to provide our neighbors with a healthy, substantial amount of food and non-food items, and we ask your help to continue this important work.

The number of neighbors reaching out to us has increased dramatically since mid-year and we expect this to continue until government relief is reinstated. We saw a reduction in need when stimulus checks were provided, but our numbers served have TRIPLED since that assistance ended.

These levels of giving are available: A donation of \$30 will cover the items pictured, an example of what each household receives. Fifty dollars provides milk for 50 families, \$75 provides 50 families with household items for a month, and \$100 covers canned and boxed items for 12 families. NO GIFT IS TOO SMALL OR TOO LARGE! We are grateful for whatever you can offer, and pledge to be good stewards of your gifts.

WINTER OUTREACH

Each year, thousands of individuals and families find themselves without decent and affordable housing with no other option, but to spend their nights sleeping on the streets of St. Louis.

Winter can be especially difficult, as shelter beds are scarce, and the weather, a dangerous force. In an effort to prevent any more weather related and senseless deaths, we have organized a volunteer outreach team consisting of service providers, students, pastoral staff and anyone willing to help.

Due to the coronavirus, Winter Outreach is only opening two or three locations. Our parish is being asked to support the shelter at **St Paul UCC, 3510 Giles**. This location will be open on any night of the week when the temperature is expected to be 20 degrees or lower without precipitation (or 25 and below with precipitation). We will be following guidelines given to us by the St. Louis Health Dept. Peggy Stein will be coordinating Saturday nights and Marie Andrews, Sundays. You are invited to help any night or with food and donations.

Please let us know if you and your family and friends would like to help this season and the nights and frequency you are available. As always, help is needed with food, setting up the space, greeting guest and working the shelter, spending the night and morning clean up. This year we are asking for donations of toiletries, toothbrushes, washcloths, large and extra-large gloves, hats, men's boxers and women's underwear, long underwear large, X-large and XX-large, leggings and hand warmers. To go food, and of course, cash is also helpful.


