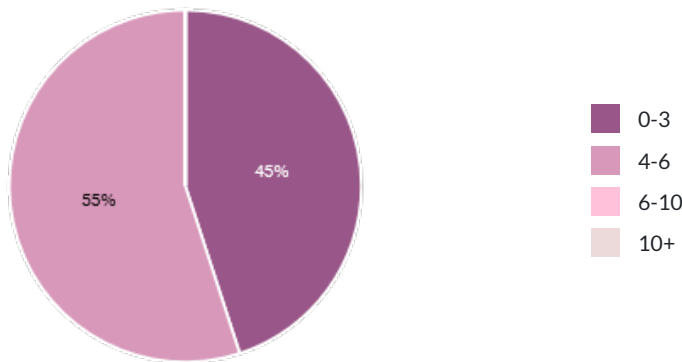

1. In the last year, how many different parish-based ministries or parish-based organizations have you participated in?

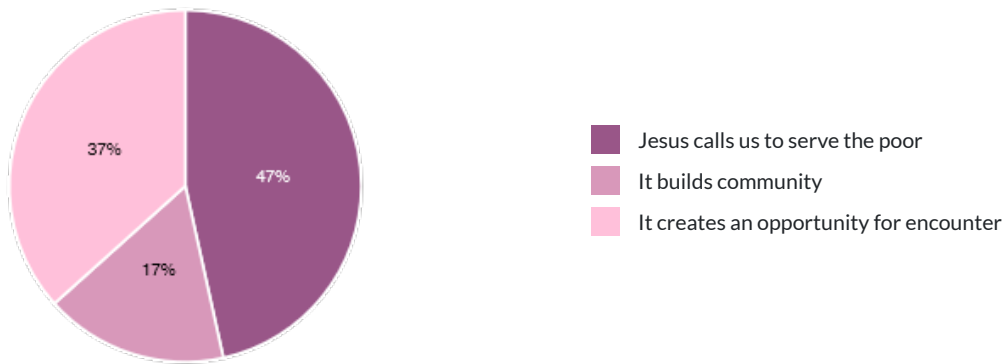

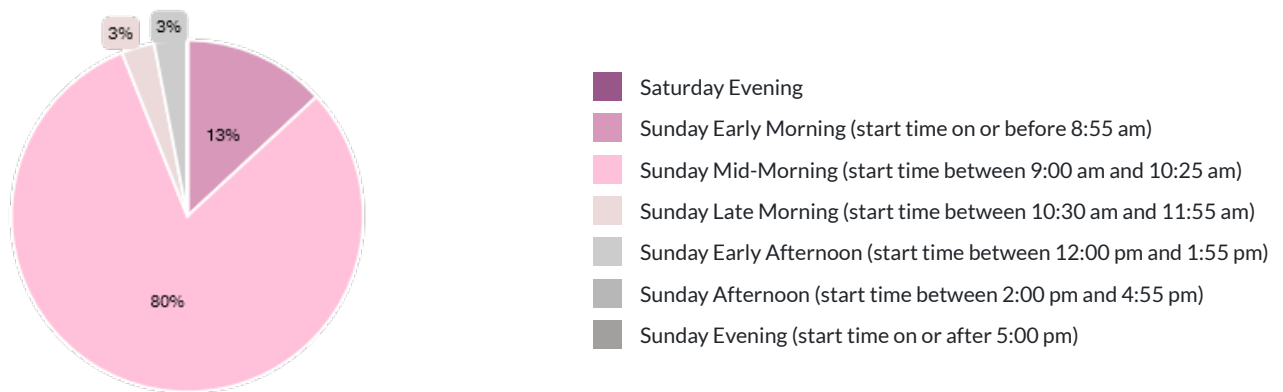

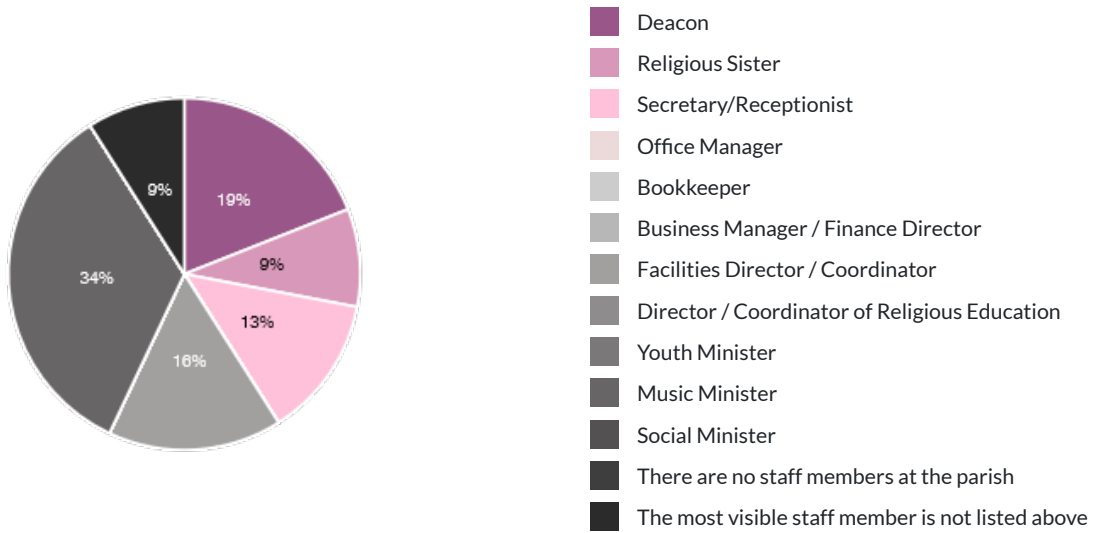

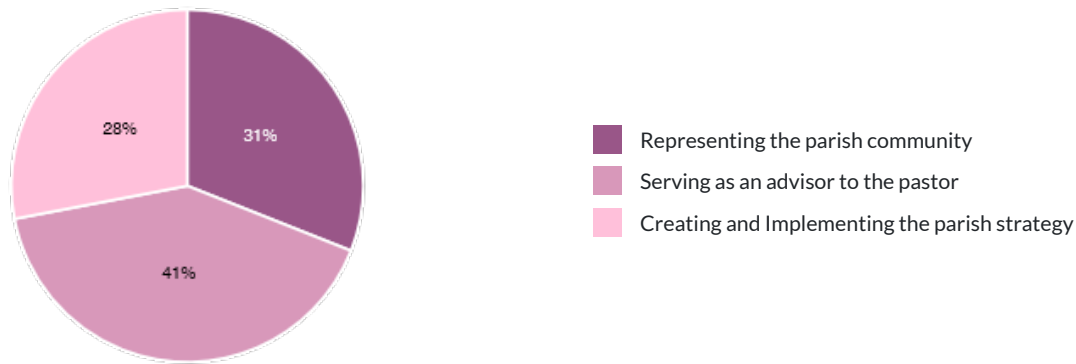

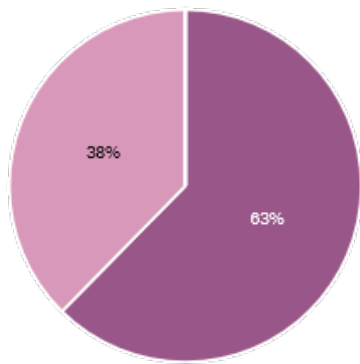

12. Which would best describe your assessment of the financial health of the parish?

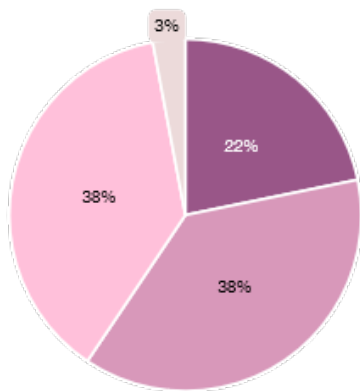


13. Which would best describe your assessment of the physical shape of your Church building?

- Lots of Memories! The Church has a lot of deferred maintenance and isn't the most welcoming or attractive of spaces.

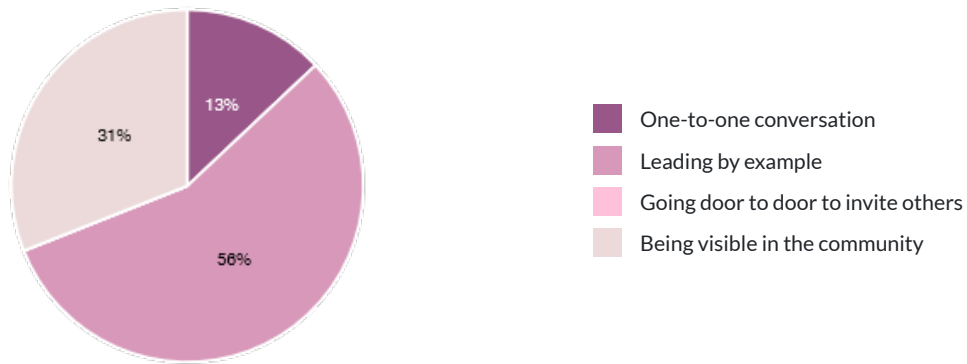
14. Which would best describe your assessment of the physical shape of the other buildings and property outside the Church building (e.g. rectory, parking lot, parish center, etc)?



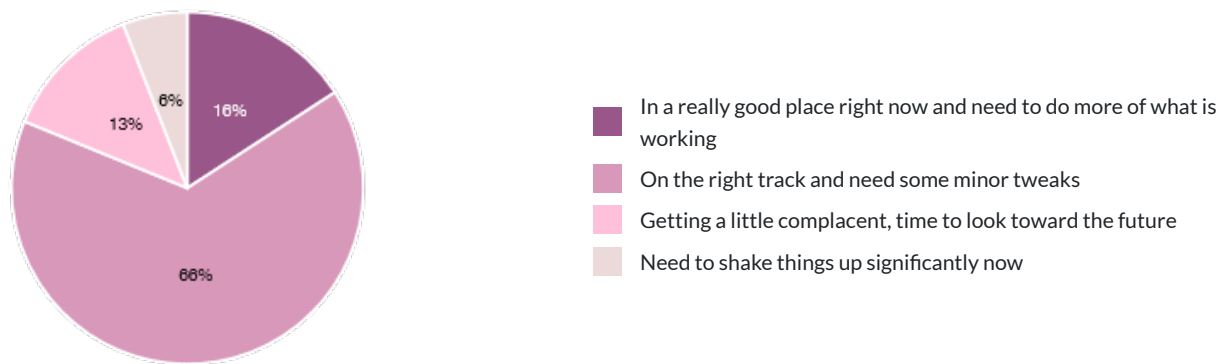
- Great! We have sufficient space for our needs and everything is in good shape

15. What is your most preferred method of bringing others closer to Christ?

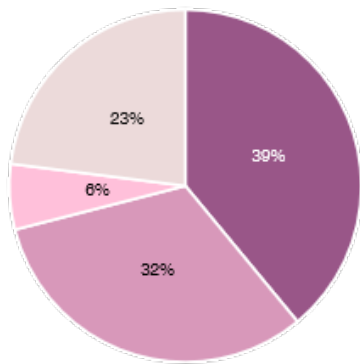




16. To what degree do you think your parish needs to change in order to best fulfill its mission in the next 5 years.
