Dear parishioners,

Some thoughts on today's Gospel (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32):

"It provokes us with simple exhortations. Recognize that the one you have lost may be right in your own household. Do whatever it takes to find the lost and then celebrate with others, both so that you can share the joy and so that the others will help prevent the recovered from ever being lost again. Don't wait until you receive an apology; you may never get one. Don't wait until you can muster the ability to forgive; you may never find it. Don't stew in your sense of being ignored, for there is nothing that can be done to retrieve the past.

Instead, go have lunch. Go celebrate, and invite others to join you. If the repenting and the forgiving come later, so much the better. And if not, you still will have done what is necessary. You will have begun a process that might lead to reconciliation. You will have opened a second chance for wholeness. Take advantage of resurrection—it is unlikely to happen twice.

What counts for the family also counts for the world...

A father had two sons ... the details can be filled in, and filled, by any among us. The scriptures of Israel give us hope for the sons in Luke's parable. They should give us hope for our own reconciliations, from the personal to the international. We need to take count not only of our blessings, but also of those in our families, in our communities. And once we count, we need to act. Finding the lost, whether they are sheep, coins, or people, takes work; It also requires our efforts, and from those efforts there is the potential for wholeness and joy.

Pre-arranged funeral plans are common in our society. Burial or cremation, choice of funeral home, visitation setting are often selected long before a person dies. Making these arrangements early saves the family added responsibility and stress in a difficult time.

**Family Faith Corner- Lent**

Lent is a time to prepare for the great feast of Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2nd) and includes 40 days to pray, fast, and give to others.

**Read Together:** Joel 2: 12  
*Even now, says the LORD, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning;*

**Discussion:** How do you want to prepare for Easter during this season of Lent? How can your family *return to the Lord* with your whole hearts?

**Activity:** Consider doing one (or more) of the following:

1. *Prayer Chain*- make 40 paper strips and write someone or something you want to pray for

on each one. Put the strips together to form a chain and remove one daily during the Lenten season and pray for the intention written on the paper link during meal time.

2. *Family Fasting*- Give up something as a family such as candy, chocolate, desserts, going out to eat, or drinking beverages other than water. Consider preparing a meal together as a family giving a task or dish to each member of the family.

3. *Acts of Service*- Create a jar with random acts of kindness and pull out a slip daily or weekly. Acts might include: give a compliment, reach out to an old friend, write a thank you note, and donate items or money to a favorite charity.

**Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32**

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation.

When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers."' So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.'"
